



CDC's IMPACT *in Ethiopia*

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) office in Ethiopia was established in 2001 and works closely with the Ministry of Health and other partners to maintain strong programs in training, treatment, counseling and testing, and laboratory capacity building.



As of September 30, 2016,

> 399,366

men, women and children received life-saving antiretroviral treatment

3.2 million

people tested 31,194 identified HIV positive



971,679

pregnant women know their HIV status in 2016 alone



In Fiscal Year 2016, of 15,163 HIV-infected pregnant women identified, **14,636 received lifelong antiretroviral therapy (ART)**



In Fiscal Year 2016 alone, of the **35,343** families and contacts of index cases who have accessed counseling and testing service, **1701** were identified **positives**



10,655 voluntary medical male circumcision procedures were performed
